Ryan also interned for the Sunflower County Freedom Project, planning and executing daily writing and speaking instructions for middle school students.

Ryan gained experience as a graduate researcher with Purpose Built Communities

in Atlanta, Georgia, where he created a data visualization tracking tool encompassing 50+ organizational data points across 18 cities and dozens of affiliated education providers that is now being used as a regularly updated measure by senior leadership. He also analyzed the early investment potential of Federal Opportunity Zones by synthesizing demographic, industry and healthcare data. Ryan also led the identification of potential health services investment partners across a 30-city network encompassing 15+ states and dozens of healthcare organizations.







While at UM, Ryan founded the McLean Entrepreneurial Leadership Program, a

Mississippi-focused entrepreneurial leadership program providing 100+, largely under-served, high school students from 20+ schools with rigorous summer-learning opportunities. In a resource-strapped state, the McLean Institute for Public Service and Community Engagement strives to break the cycle of poverty through education. Ryan helped lead the charge, restructuring their data gathering strategy and partnering with non-profits statewide to develop scalable solutions for community development in impoverished areas.

Upon graduation, Ryan was employed as an Analyst with the ProMatura Group in Oxford,

Mississippi, where he helped national and international housing developers assess the viability of potential age-qualified housing communities through analysis of market demand, consumer preferences and demographics. Subsequently, Ryan served as consultant for the development of \$750+ million of senior living and multi-family construction, worldwide.
